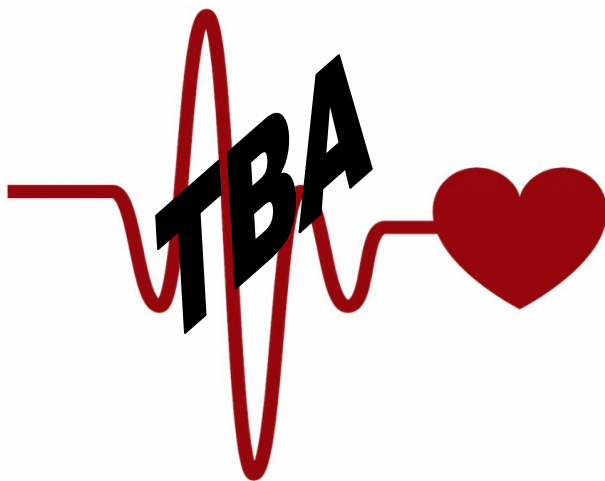

Identified Need:

Heart disease is the **leading cause of death** for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups in the United States. **One person dies every 34 seconds** in the United States from cardiovascular disease. About **697,000 people in the United States** died from heart disease in 2020—that's **1 in every 5 deaths**. Heart disease cost the United States about **\$229 billion** each year from 2017 to 2018. This includes the cost of health care services, medicines, and lost productivity due to death.
